

SUPPLY LIST - 3D Embellishments - Hydrangea by Marina Towne

In this class, we will make a small wall hanging (14" L x 13" W), of a hydrangea with 3D petals, leaves and a dragonfly. We will use two fabrics bonded, wrong sides together, to create each 3D motif. Embroidery stitches will hold the motifs in place.

The pattern and a plastic template for the petals will be provided.

Fabric:

- Background: 14" x 15", in a color that contrasts and complements the petals.
- Petals: one fat quarter (8" x 22"), preferably batik, in pinks or blues.
- Stem: one piece of green fabric 7" x 1" preferably cut on the bias.
- Leaves: four pieces of green fabric scraps, 2 ½" x 4".
- Dragonfly wings: Cotton or something shiny, 6" square. If the fabric is flimsy, like organza, bring a piece of cotton fabric in the same size to stabilize it.
- Backing: 15" x 16", bigger if you want to add a border. *We won't do the quilt sandwich in the class so you don't need to bring this along.*

Other Supplies:

- Glass beads: 25 or so. This is optional and only if you want to use beads and not French knots for the petal centers. Glass because they don't melt when you iron them.
- Thread...very little is needed.
 - Petal centers*—cotton floss to make French knots, in a color that contrasts with the petal fabric or silver metallic floss.
 - Leaf veins*—floss slightly darker green than the leaves.
 - Dragonfly*—black floss.
 - Stem*—50wt to 100wt cotton or polyester, green to match fabric.
- Note: embroidery floss is regular DMC #25, 6 strand.
- Buttons about 1/4" or so for dragonfly body, in black or other dark color.
- HeatnBond Ultra-Hold Iron on adhesive, a 10" x 17" piece.

- Erasable fabric marker to trace the petals and leaves.
- Needles—Crewel/Embroidery size 6 and a selection of needles in other sizes.
- Basic sewing supplies including fabric scissors, thread snips, straight pins, etc.
- Batting: 15" x 16", Bigger if you want to add a border. *We won't do the quilt sandwich in class so you don't need to bring this along.*
- Sewing machine: bring to class if you want to machine appliqué the stem...it'll be faster than sewing by hand. *Don't bring to class if you plan to hand appliqué the stem.*

Note: The quote is optional. If you want to include it on your quilt, you can write the letters using a Pigma pen or stitch them using hand embroidery or machine quilting
